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Introduction
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When working on site under a Principal Contractor we will ensure that we adhere to their security arrangements throughout the project. Should our works need to be physically segregated from other contractors when on site we ensure that a Heras fencing barrier is erected (if this is not sufficient at the time then we will liaise with the principal contractor to come up with a suitable alternative).

When we are carrying out work directly for a client and the security arrangements are our responsibility we, as a general rule, will ensure that Heras fencing is provided. This will surround the perimeter of the working area including any site compound and shall be the segregation between the site operatives and any other third parties. Where Heras fencing is not appropriate we will provide solid hoarding (or any other suitable method of segregation. This will be determined at the pre-construction phase).

We ensure that access to the site is under supervision at all times and ensure that any visitors to site are through appointments only allowing us to ensure that the site is safe for them to enter when needed.

Should there be any site-specific security arrangements required e.g. watchmen, security lighting etc. then this will be communicated at the pre-construction phase and shall be introduced where necessary.

For small domestic work sites, no tooling, equipment or plant will be left on site unless agreed with the client. In all cases tooling will be locked away and any equipment or plant will be immobilised and the keys removed from site to prevent unauthorised use.
